UNIQUE ACADEMIC OFFERINGS:


Austin Catholic prepares its students to think critically, solve problems creatively and work independently. Student learning plans are tailored to the academic needs and abilities of the student throughout the four years. Academic opportunities and advancement are available through honors class sections, CTE opportunities, advance placement, and dual enrollment at community college. OUR STEAM program includes core math and science curriculum as well as fine arts and religion components to solve real-life problems. With new science labs, a fine arts curriculum and team-taught classes, student experience a full range of academic and fine arts related learning. Ninth, 11th and 12th grade seminars support students with mini units on study skills, SAT/ACT prep and college and career readiness. All students participate in "minimester" a two-week exploratory unit designed to meet graduation requirements. During minimester, students select a variety of experiences ranging from sewing to historical sites in Michigan to designing a pop-up store business model. Minimester focuses on group engagement, core values and life/career skill development.

FAITH DEVELOPMENT:

We provide students with a faith-based learning environment both inside and outside the classroom. While nearly 90% of our students are Catholic, a multitude of other faiths are represented within our community as well. Students are required to take four years of theology courses, attend weekly mass, participate in annual class retreats and complete at least 44 service hours over four years. FAITH DEVELOPMENT:

FGR focuses on growing relationships with God among our students. The four pillars of Campus Ministry are Encounter (meet Him), Prayer (know Him), Discernment (listen to Him), and Mission (make Him known). Our Campus Ministry activities are designed to complement the academic and catechetical learning that takes place within the four years of theology class, and help students become intentional disciples of Christ. All students attend Holy Mass twice weekly, with optional daily Mass available. Weekly Bible Studies are available. Annual retreats are taken by each grade level and the Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered multiple times each week. Service hours are required each year. Our Households program provides opportunity for students and faculty to forge authentic relationships as we strive to love God and love others.

UNIQUE ACADEMIC OFFERINGS:

FGR offers a Capstone program that goes beyond AP. This elective offers students an opportunity to explore in depth an interdisciplinary topic of their choosing, preparing to present a 30-minute presentation at the end of the semester as a culmination of their high school learning experience. Philosophy electives have recently been added to complement our theology courses. We offer a variety of advanced science courses including Honors Anatomy and Physiology and Advanced Chemistry (also known as Food Chemistry) as well as AP Chemistry, Physics C, and Biology. Currently, a total of 12 AP courses are offered across the curriculum.

Our service program is highlighted by our Senior Service program which has been a staple at U of D Jesuit since 1971. Our seniors spend 14 Wednesdays throughout the school year volunteering at soup kitchens, food pantries, schools, or medical facilities for an entire day and living out our mission. We aim to form young men who will be intellectually competent, religious, loving, open to growth, and committed to doing justice.

UNIQUE ACADEMIC OFFERINGS:

U of D Jesuit offers 14 AP and a number of honors classes, as well as dual enrollment opportunities to allow students to challenge themselves at a high level, beginning in 7th grade. Students can further challenge themselves by taking classes through the Arrupe Virtual Learning Institute (AVLI) which connects students to a network of Jesuit educators around the world. Our Arrupe Learning Center provides support to all students with learning challenges. Peer and faculty office hours are also available for those students who seek additional help.
